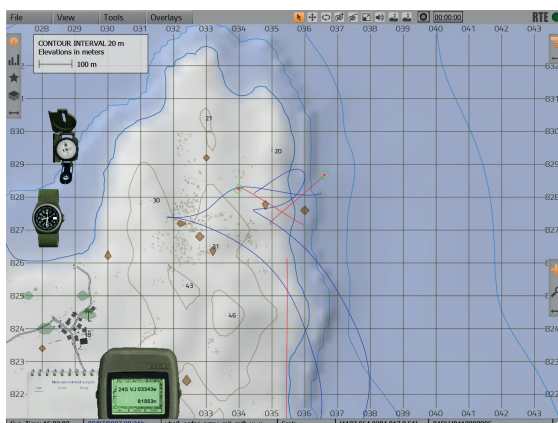
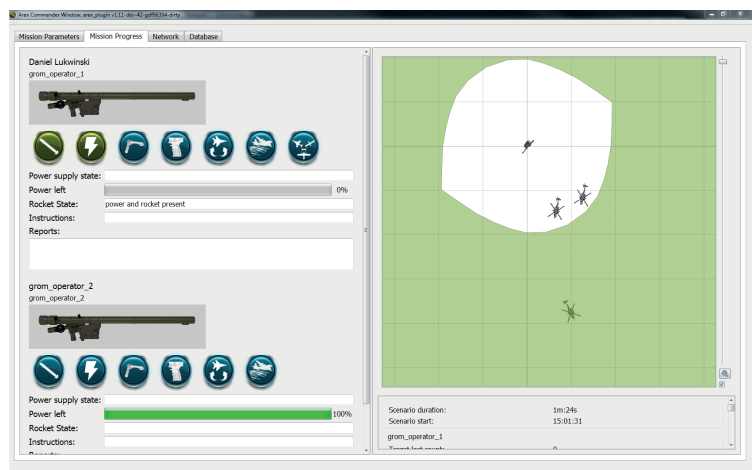

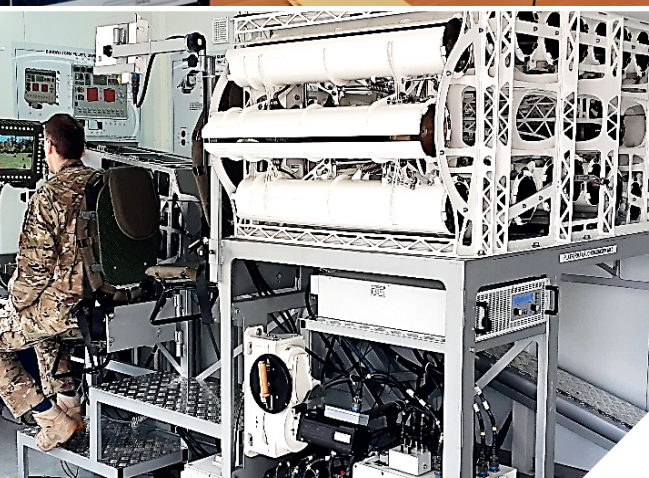

Operator Stand comprises a weapon mock-up, display and speakers. The image seen by the operator is visualised on high-class 3D operator glasses or screen. Sounds generated during the simulation are transmitted through helmet-integrated headsets or through speakers. The visualisation system is based on VBS3 simulation software.

Instructor Stand is composed of computer with software for battlefield simulation and assessment.

TRYTON training simulator platform has been designed for further increase of exercises' realism. It is intended for operator training in the execution of fire tasks during sea mission or from a moving vehicle.
